Burkitt Scholarships

The Governing Body of Durham Cathedral Schools Foundation is committed to widening access to the benefits of a Durham School education through the provision of financial assistance in the form of scholarships and/or bursaries. The Burkitt Scholarships are awarded to candidates at 16+ entering Year 12.

They are worth £1,000 per year and can be supplemented by means-tested bursaries up to 95% of the School tuition fees.

The Burkitt Scholarship Examination for September 2025 entry into Durham School will be held on 23rd November 2024. The deadline for applications is Friday 8th November 2024.

• Burkitt Scholars are eligible for support worth up to £1,000 per annum if successful in gaining entry to either Oxford or Cambridge University.

• Burkitt Scholarships are available to both external entrants and current Durham School Year 11 pupils. King's Scholars need not apply.


Scholarships Process

Burkitt candidates must take assessments in English, Mathematics, and online reasoning tests. Applicants also attend an interview with the Headmaster or Head of Sixth Form.

Entry Requirements

Burkitt Scholarships are awarded provisionally in December, based on performance in the tests taken. Burkitt Scholarships are confirmed in August, subject to satisfactory achievement at GCSE. The threshold for provisional awards is benchmarked against standards in previous years.

Candidates apply from a wide variety of local schools, particularly those in Sunderland and County Durham. Further funds are attached to each bursary to ensure every pupil can fully participate in all aspects of life at Durham Cathedral Schools Foundation.

History

Durham Cathedral Schools Foundation comprises the Preparatory School Chorister School and the Senior School Durham School. These two institutions merged in September 2021 to offer a coeducational education to pupils aged 3-18.

Lt Colonel Henry Burkitt



A magnificent bequest was made towards bursaries at Durham Cathedral Schools Foundation by Lieutenant Colonel Henry Gale Stewart Burkitt. He was a pupil at Durham School between 1926 to 1932.

Having been educated at Cambridge, he joined the Indian Army and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. He retired from the Army in 1948 and then went to Oxford where he read Law.

He was always a strong supporter of Durham School and had indicated some time ago that he intended to leave the residue of his estate to Durham School, now the Foundation, in order to provide opportunities for young people to study at Durham.

The Burkitt Bequest, made in 1985, was over £400,000. Since 1986, hundreds of young people have been given a chance to study for A Levels at Durham School thanks to his generosity.

Most of our pupils go on to study at university, with the majority attending a Russell Group University, including Oxford and Cambridge.

Pupils can choose to study three or four subjects to A Level/BTEC, and may also complete an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), worth half an A Level. It is possible to study four A Levels, but we recommend 3 unless taking Further Mathematics. Universities want the three <u>best</u> grades



With this practice, and subsequent feedback on how to improve, I received offers to study at every university I interviewed at. This would not have been possible without the help provided by Durham School and the Burkitt Scholarship.

Durham School's generous scholarship enabled me to study for my A Levels at this wonderful school. I particularly enjoyed the opportunities to engage in the many clubs and societies within the School.

The small class sizes were beneficial in maximising the support from my teachers and increasing my passion for my subjects. I was able to help as a peer mentor for younger pupils. The Sixth Form Lecture Series, which I regularly attend, broadened my knowledge base and allowed me to gain an insight into a variety of subjects which I would not have thought to explore.

The friendly atmosphere of Durham School enabled my academic and social progression. I had the room to grow and develop crucial skills such as communication, leadership and teamwork throughout my time there.

The closing date for the Burkitt Scholarship applications is 8th November. The Admissions team will send you sample examination papers after you apply.


